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If your transfer goals for baccalaureate study cannot be attained through existing programs, SUNY Broome's Individual Studies degree offers you the opportunity to design a degree that will meet your needs. With the help of an academic advisor, you can select courses and develop an "Advised Career Pathway" that will allow selection of just the right balance of General Education and concentration area coursework to meet transfer program requirements while earning a degree.

ADVISED CAREER PATHWAY TO TRANSFER

Create a pathway to your Bachelor's degree by selecting the General Education requirements and concentration courses needed at your transfer school:

- · Based on consultation with a transfer counselor at the selected transfer institution
- Or -
- Based on one of the many articulation agreements between SUNY Broome and four year colleges/universities

REQUIREMENTS OF THE DEGREE

Within your degree, you will complete 7 of the 10 SUNY General Education areas (30 credits) required for an Associate in Science degree and a selection of electives to meet your transfer program requirements. An Associate in Science degree is highly regarded when you transfer.

- Complete the five (5) required SUNY General Education areas in English, Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Mathematics
- Choose an additional two (2) SUNY General Education courses from Foreign Language, The ARTS, Western Civilization, Other World Civilizations, U.S. History
- Complete one (1) credit of Physical Education Cardiovascular
- Choose Advised Career Pathway courses to meet the 63-credit degree minimum.

At SUNY Broome only 12 credits meet the residency requirement; you can use up to 51 earned credits from other colleges, College – Level Examination Program (CLEP), or the military. (Courses with a grade of C or better can be applied to the degree.) 100% of course requirements can be completed on-line through SUNY Broome.

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SUGGESTED SEQUENCE OF COURSES

This model is a two-year course schedule (leading to an A.S. degree) for students meeting all program requirements and deciding to pursue full-time study. Schedules will be redesigned for those requiring preparatory courses or those deciding to pursue part-time study.

FIRST YEAR

Fall Semester 15-16 Credits

- ENG 110 Academic Writing I
- Mathematics General Education approved course, or developmental course as needed
- · Social Science General Education approved course
- · Advised Career Pathway courses

Spring Semester 15-16 Credits

- Mathematics General Education approved course (only if developmental math was needed in First Semester)
- General Education selection: Foreign Language, The ARTS, Western or Other World Civilization, or U.S. History
- · Advised Career Pathway courses
- Physical Education cardiovascular

SECOND YEAR

Fall Semester 15-16 Credits

- Natural Science General Education approved course
- 2nd General Education selection: Choose one from Foreign Language, The ARTS, Western or Other World Civilization, or U.S. History
- · Advised Career Pathway courses

Spring Semester 15-16 Credits

- ENG 220 Communicating About Ideas and Values
- · Advised Career Pathway courses
