The housing board budget is being presented at their April meeting. Hiring freeze and clarification and updated PAR forms were distributed to campus key staff. Capital projects were submitted to the county last week.

Human Resources and Student Finance Update

Ms. Hodel attended an EAB webinar on talent acquisitions with a focus on employee morale, retention, and hiring policies.
