#### Student Success

The Enrollment newsletter was distributed. Numbers are down 0.14% in FTE. Monitoring Fast Forward - should be ending next week. Calls and emails to MMR non-compliant students have gone out. There are still 80 that are non-compliant. Meningitis non-compliant numbers are down too. Interesting questions about the SUNY Presidents' service areas agreement and advertising in certain areas - non-overlap advertising. At SUNY admissions meeting - not honoring president's agreement. Dr. Hawkins commented some NYCCAP are discussing a regional area, especially in areas of Health Care.

The BAP discontinuation was announced at SUNY's Enrollment meeting. Discussion on messaging to the campus community was discussed.
