- Focus is on COVID testing establishing a smooth process
 - First pilot testing all negative
 - Chancellors visit yesterday another pool pulled together and sent to Upstate awaiting results
 - Official program for testing starting next week
 - Employees as well as student in on campus classes
 - Wastewater testing will begin in Student Village
 - As a community we are doing well in social distance, mask wearing, etc.
- Addressing the impact of retirement incentive on budget and personnel
 - Determine how to fill vacancies as well as maintain operations

A. Technology Committee (John Petkash)

B. Distance Learning Steering Committee (Carine Surdey)

- · Have not met since last COI Update
- Working on Best Practices for remote instruction
- Campus is working on Spring schedule to minimize changes
- Marty emphasizes that once registration opens to student there will be no changes to the schedule for fall.

C. CPAC Update (David Ligeikis)

- Much turnover on CPAC
 - Putting a restructuring plan in place for that committee
 - Will bring plan to COI next meeting
- Pool testing and wastewater testing of water from Student Village
 - Wastewater testing to compliments pool testing
 - Water testing twice a week once Auto Sampler is in place
 - If wastewater shows sign of COVID, Student Village tested
- Old science and student services
 - Work done on windows and exhaust fans installed to increase fresh air flow Fans may be noisy, but they are necessary for air exchange
- Update on Wales Building
 - No heat or air working on it due to change in temperature

VII.Ongoing Business

A. Intercampus communication for new hire or position change (Lynn Fedorchak)

- No update many changes right now with separation incentive
- · Will revisit when things settle

B. SLAC Memo from CAI

- SLAC historically collected assessment results and had responsibilities that are no longer necessary for that group due to Nuventive
- Do we need another assessment committee?
- SLAC has been dissolved so that is not a question
- CAI would like to create a new committee to promote assessment
 - Does COI endorse this?
 - Is this within COI's purview?

C. Recordings of CA meetings

D. Joint FCCC-UFS VNC Resolution

- Vote of no confidence some campuses have chosen to endorse, but not all
 - Concern of repercussions, press releases, response from local communities
 - Specific examples of campuses that have voted to endorse have already been published on Wikipedia
 - What is the fine print?
 - Largely symbolic vote Goal of the resolution is to give unified voice for community colleges The FCCC resolution stems from political appointments causing tension With this one, there was no national search
- Flip side is we are in a pandemic, there was an immediate need, search would be costly Ciara makes motion to vote whether or not to endorse the FCCC resolution.
 - Kerry Weber seconds
- · Brittney will send out Google form for voting
 - Yes = Endorse
 - No = Do not endorse
 - Abstain
