Institutional Effectiveness

The last of the winter IPED Surveys were submitted. Drs. Malmberg, McLain, and Haynes met with SUNY on the migration of Blackboard/Brightspace. The results of the survey from the fall 2021 Hyflex students were distributed. Overall, the results show this type of learning platform is very successful and students would like more Hyflex course options. The results will be shared with the Distance Learning group this afternoon. There will be a call out to faculty to offer Hyflex fall courses.

Finance and Facilities

Budget and Finance has the final draft budget for Dr. Drumm's review. The timeline of this will go to the Board of Trustees in March. An update to the Sustainability Plan and monthly Forecast is being finalized. A preliminary look at capital project requests has been made and will be prioritized. Refinancing of the Student Village is being developed. The feasibility plan needs to be updated. A solid marketing plan also needs to be developed.

Student Development and Diversity Update

Student Chancellor Award nominees have been submitted. The first AVP/DOS interview is tomorrow. The Woman & Men's basketball teams lost their games against Jefferson. The last game will be at Carrier Dome next week.

Academic Affairs Update

PROSTAR articulations are being developed by M. Stamets for the Culinary program which will expand our area of outreach. There will be a PROSTAR conference at the CEC. The first Culinary Advisory committee meeting will be in March. The Academic Leadership is working on the fall schedule and reaching out to chairs. The Pathways Committee has 10 working groups that will be reviewing their programs. Financial Concerns and Onboarding working group have also been added. The onboarding group will look at current processes. A committee will be formed to address the Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) initiative from SUNY.

Human Resources Update
