#### Institutional Effectiveness

Dr. McLain reported the final IPEDs spring survey was submitted. This encompassed Human Resources, Finance, the Library, and fall enrollment. The TRC continues to offer clean-up course sessions for the pending LMS migration. They have been extremely well attended. SEM is making progress and developing strategies.

#### **Finance and Facilities**

The meeting with County officials was on Friday, April 1. The group presented the budget, sustainability plan, and nursing update. The meeting went extremely well. The college is only asking for 1% in Sponsorshare. Mr. Sullivan thanked Dr. Haynes for her contribution to the meeting. ESPA and the FA are heading to an impasse. Mr. Sullivan will work with key stakeholders. The GUILD agreement was ratified and will go to Board for approval. He will present the Sustainability plan to Board next week.

# **Student Development and Diversity Update**

Broome participated in its first track and field competition and did a decent job. A few women qualified for the National competition. It is a start and students are excited. If the college can afford it, lacrosse may be offered again. There are 17 teams in the league. Softball and baseball season started. The BAGSAI field is losing its contract with the county. The bias incident was settled. The activities fee topic will go to COI to remind them that student activities fees are to be used for students only.
